School Intimate Care Policy

Introduction:

Our Schools are committed to ensuring that all staff responsible for intimate care of children and young people will undertake their duties in a professional manner at all times.

The schools take seriously their responsibility to safeguard and promote the welfare of the children and young people in its care.

The Governing Body recognises its duties and responsibilities in relation to the Equality Act 2010 which requires that any child with an impairment that affects his/her ability to carry out normal day-to-day activities must not be discriminated against.

We recognise that there is a need for children and young people to be treated with respect when intimate care is given.

No child shall be attended to in a way that causes distress, embarrassment or pain.

Staff will work in close partnership with parents and carers to share information and provide continuity of care.

Definition:

Intimate care is defined as any care which involves washing, touching or carrying out an invasive procedure that most children and young people carry out for themselves, but which some are unable to do. Disabled pupils may be unable to meet their own care needs for a variety of reasons and will require regular support.

Our approach to best practice:

- The management of all children with intimate care needs will be carefully planned.
- Staff who provide intimate care are trained to do so (including Child Protection,
 Hygiene and Health and Moving and Handling where appropriate) and fully aware
 of best practice. All staff at the school who carry out intimate care will have been
 subject to an enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS).
- Where specialist equipment and facilities above that currently available in the school are required, every effort will be made to provide appropriate facilities in a timely fashion, following assessment by a Physiotherapist and/or Occupational Therapist.
- There is careful communication with any pupil who requires intimate care in line with their preferred means of communication to discuss needs and preferences.
- Staff will be supported to adapt their practice in relation to the needs of individual children taking into account developmental changes such as the onset of puberty and menstruation.
- Staff will be provided with equipment required to carry out the intimate care procedure safely, including protective gloves, aprons, cleaning supplies, bins.
- Pupils will be supported to achieve the highest level of independence possible, according to their individual condition and abilities
- Individual care plans will be drawn up for any pupil requiring regular intimate care
- Careful consideration will be given to individual situations to determine how many adults should be present during intimate care procedures. Where possible one pupil will be cared for by one adult unless there is a sound reason for having more adults present. In such a case, the reasons will be documented.
- Intimate care arrangements will be discussed with parents/carers on a regular basis and recorded on the care plan. For pupils needing routine intimate care, the school expects parents to provide the necessary resources, such as nappies, underwear, spare clothing etc. Any soiled clothing will be contained securely and discreetly returned to parents at the end of the day.
- The needs and wishes of children and parents will be taken into account wherever possible, within the constraints of staffing and equal opportunities legislation
- Where a care plan is not in place and a child has needed help with intimate care
 (in the case of a toilet 'accident') parental permission will be sought before
 performing any intimate care procedure. If school are unable to make contact,
 the intimate care procedure will be carried out to ensure the child is comfortable,
 then parents/carers will be informed the same day. This information should be
 treated as confidential and communicated in person, via telephone or by sealed
 letter (not via the home school diary)

Child Protection:

The Governors and staff of The Redeemer/St Stephen's Tockholes recognise that disabled children are particularly vulnerable to all forms of abuse.

Child Protection and Multi-Agency Child Protection procedures will be adhered to at all times.

If a member of staff has any concerns about physical changes in a child's presentation (unexplained marks, bruises or soreness for example) they will immediately report concerns to a DSL using the school's safeguarding procedures.

If a child becomes distressed or unhappy about being cared for by a particular member of staff, the matter will be investigated at an appropriate level and outcomes recorded.

Parents/carers will be contacted at the earliest opportunity as part of the process of reaching a resolution. Further advice will be taken from partner agencies.

If a child makes an allegation about a member of staff this will be investigated in accordance with agreed procedures.
