He will be taken to a vet immediately in the event of signs of ill health. Treacle will receive up to date flea and worming treatments. Agreement that confirms if unwell Treacle will not be brought to school or removed from school site. Arrangements are in place for care during holidays and weekend. Members of staff involved in the housing, feeding, handling and care requirements are experienced. Bedding kept clean for the well-being of the animal, pupils and staff Treacle to be regularly groomed and bathed. An insurance policy will be implemented. 	L
